

TRAINING COURSE

Description: Tower Crane Rescue, Emergencies & Evacuation
Duration: 1 Day
Max Number of Delegates: 6

Prerequisite:

- Delegates must show evidence of their competency for working at height. It is advised that anyone attending the course has completed the 'RGT1 Harness Training & Work at Height Awareness' or equivalent recognised course.
- Delegates must meet the minimum age of 18 years and be fluent in English.
- Delegates must be medically fit and be physically able to carry out the practical elements of the course. Delegates will be required to sign a medical statement from before the start of the course.

Course:

This training course is designed for rescue teams who are responsible for rescuing and evacuating workers from tower cranes. This course complies with the requirements of Construction Plant Hire Association technical note TIN013 'rescue of personnel at height on Tower Cranes'. Rescue teams will need to be wearing fall protection equipment so the training will also cover rescue procedures for suspended operatives. On completion of the course, delegates will be able to identify suitable anchor points and correctly set up and use a rescue kit designed for tower cranes and identify safe descent paths whilst taking care of a casualty.

Course Content:

- Tower crane rescue equipment
- Raising and lowering techniques
- Stretcher fitting
- Rescue harness fitting
- Identification of safe descent paths
- Suspension intolerance
- Evacuation from a man riding basket
- Rescue and evacuation from a leading edge
- Use of a tag line
- Casualty care

Training Methods:

This training course combines theory and practical training methods to ensure delegates receive the information required in preparation for their assessment. Printed course material, practical demonstrations and hands on training will be conducted throughout the course.

All training is designed and delivered to meet BS 8454:2006 code of practice for the delivery of training and education for work at height and rescue and complies with the requirements of Construction Plant Hire Association technical note TIN013 'rescue of personnel at height on Tower Cranes'.

Certification:

On successful completion of the course, delegates will receive a 3 year RIDGEGEAR certificate. Delegates must keep up their CPD by attending regular training to refresh their skillset.

PPE Requirements:

Delegates must provide their own comfortable clothing, protective footwear, safety gloves, high visibility jacket and prepare for all weather conditions. Delegates may be required to provide their own PPE but this will be communicated by RIDGEGEAR in the planning stage of training.
